Methodology

Type of Sample: Probabilistic, multi-stage and stratified, with proportional sampling of age and gender

Unit of Analysis: Registered voters in the REP

Location of the Unit of Analysis: In the home

Margin of Error: 2.16%

Confidence Level: 95%

Sample Size: 2,000 interviews

Sample Range: 20 States

Proportional distribution to the weight of the states with a statistical management of the dispersion of the sample

Dates of Field Work: November 19 – November 25

When applicable, results compared with those of previous surveys

Goal: Gather the opinions of Venezuela voters, registered in the REP with respect to the political climate in Venezuela.

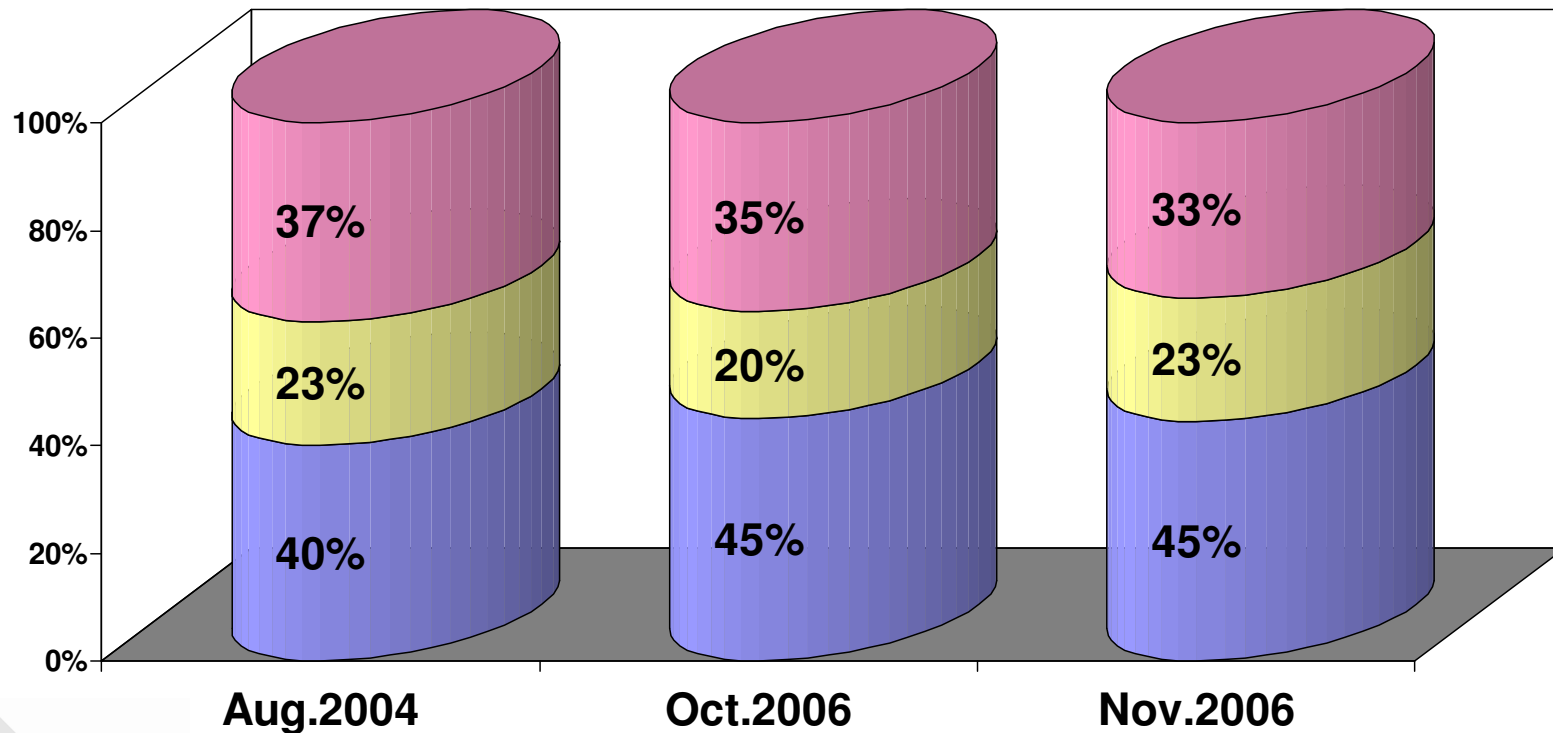

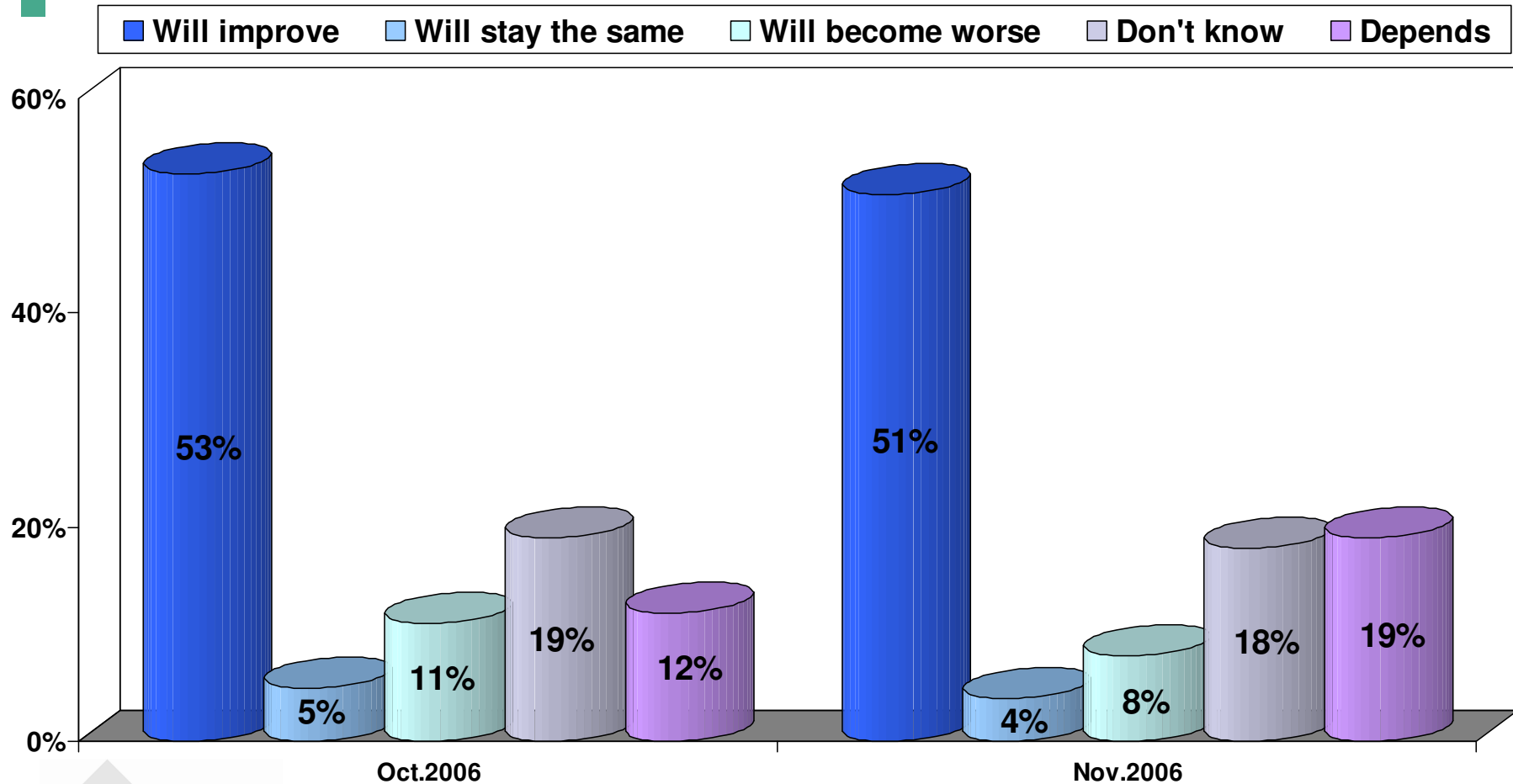
Direction of Venezuela

Do you feel that things in Venezuela are generally going in the right direction, or do you feel things have gotten pretty seriously off on the wrong track?

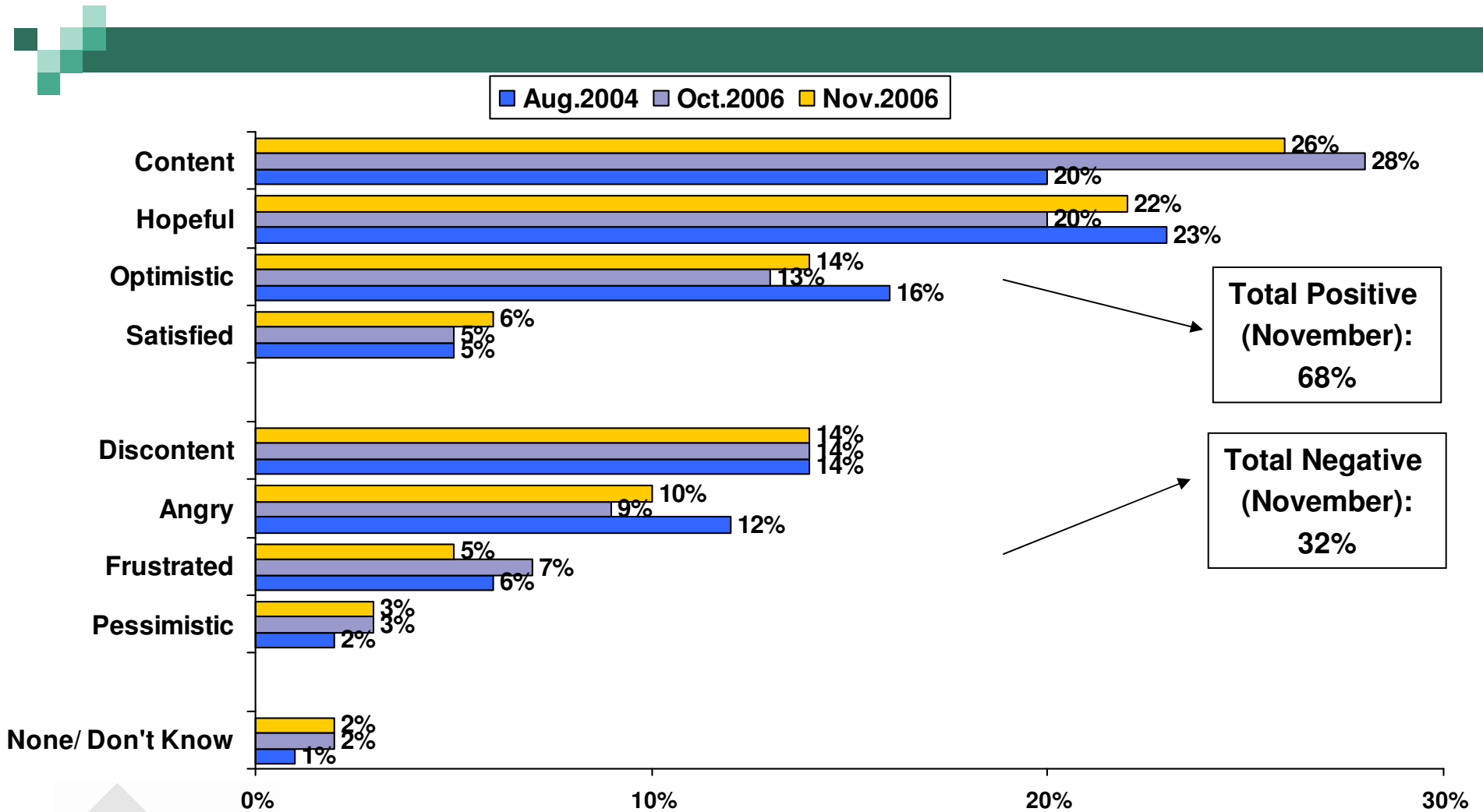
■ Right direction ■ Okay / Refused / Don't know ■ Wrong track



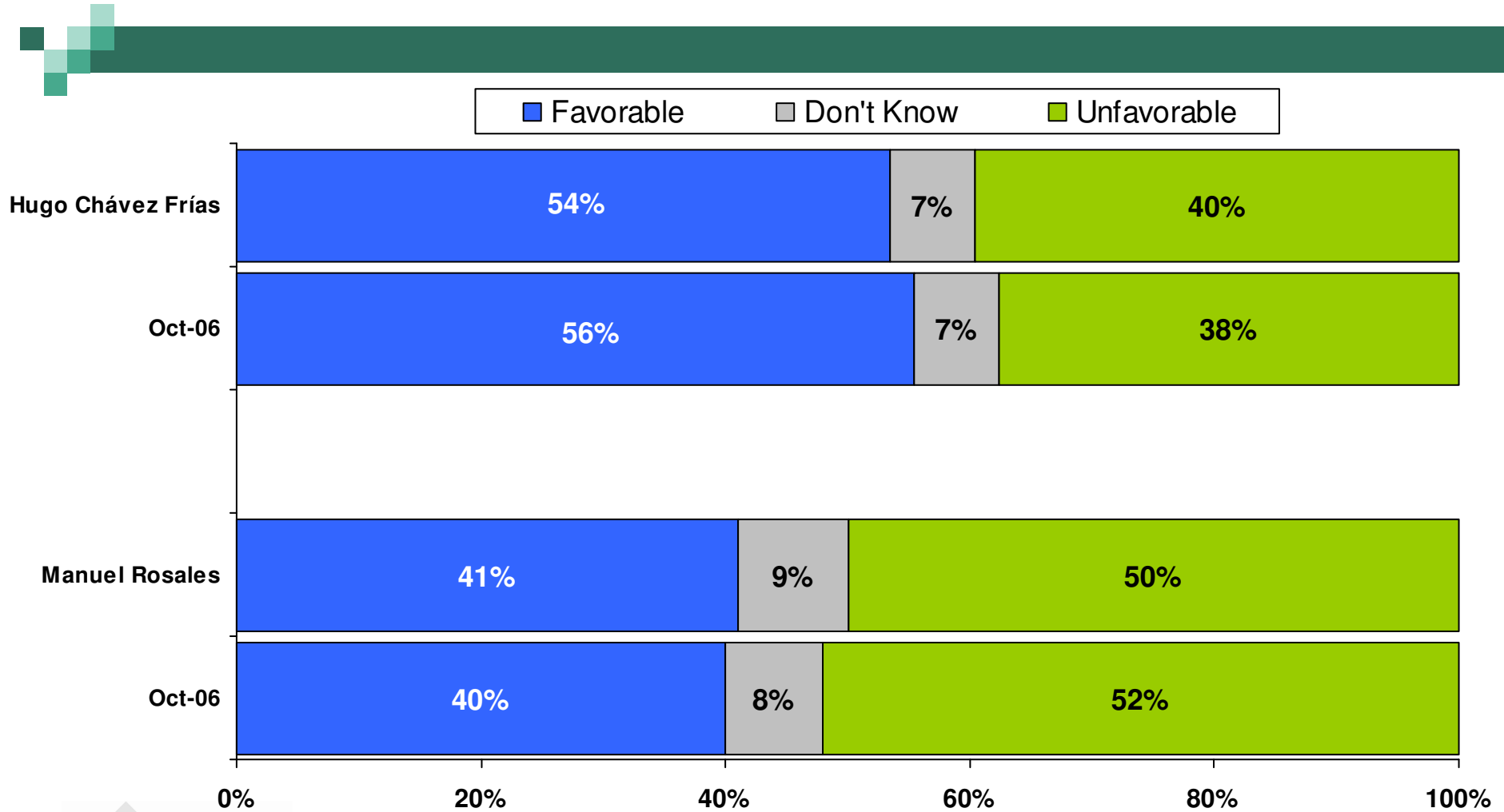
Feeling About the Next Two or Three Years



Term that Best Describes your Feelings about the Current state of the Country

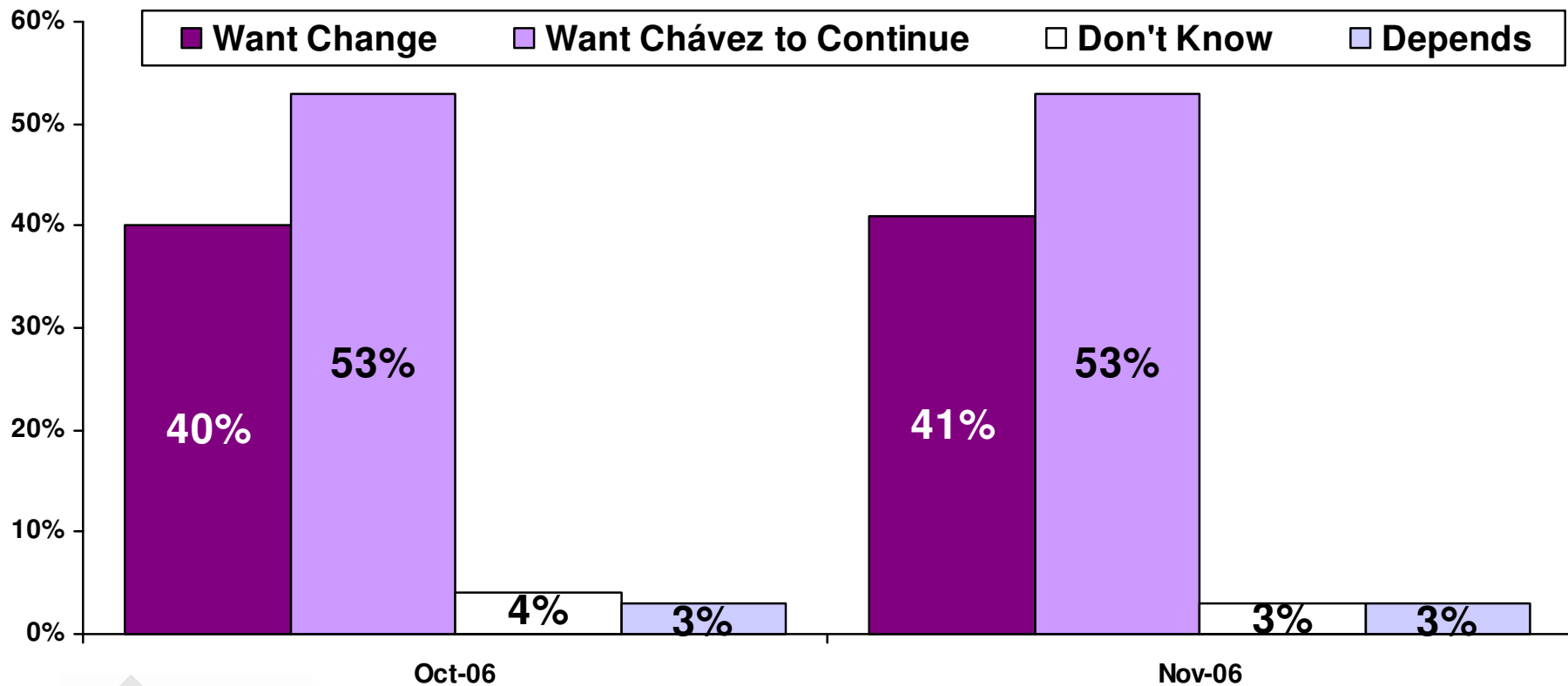

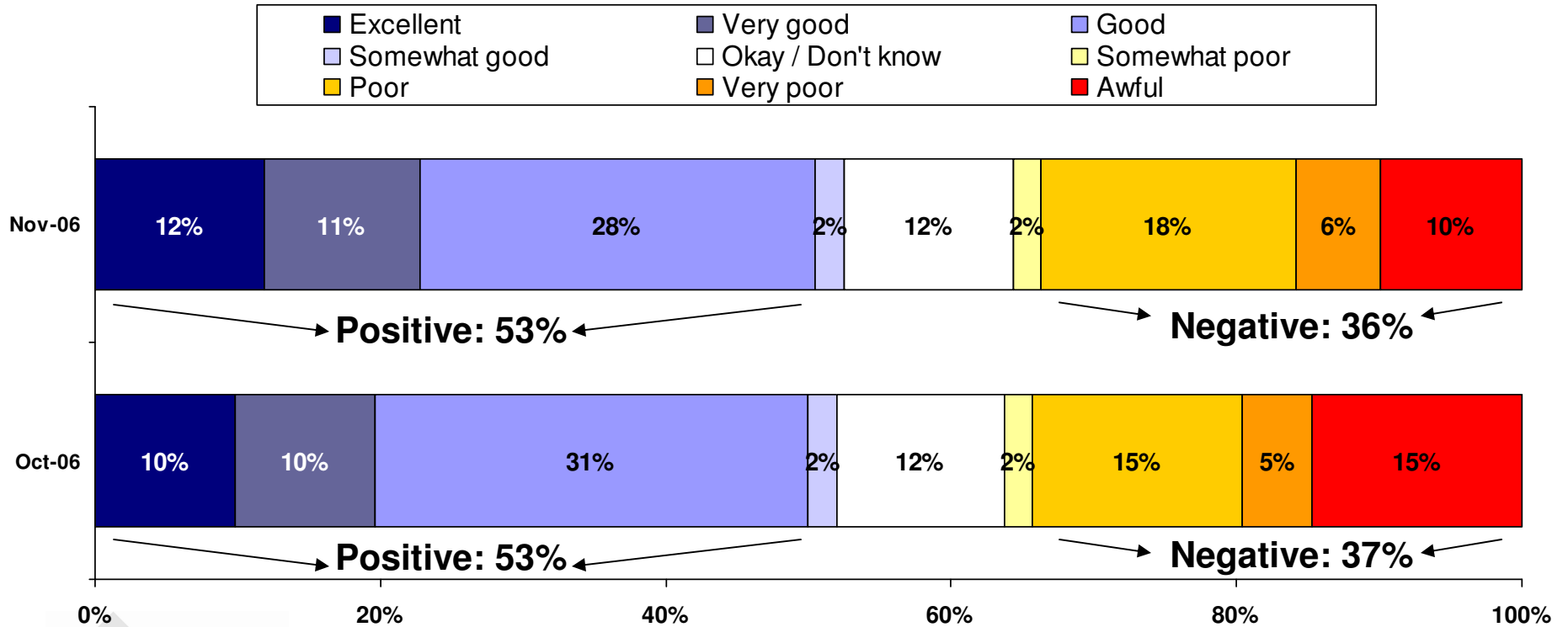
In the December presidential elections, do you want a change of government or do you want Chávez to continue as president?

Government of President Hugo Chávez

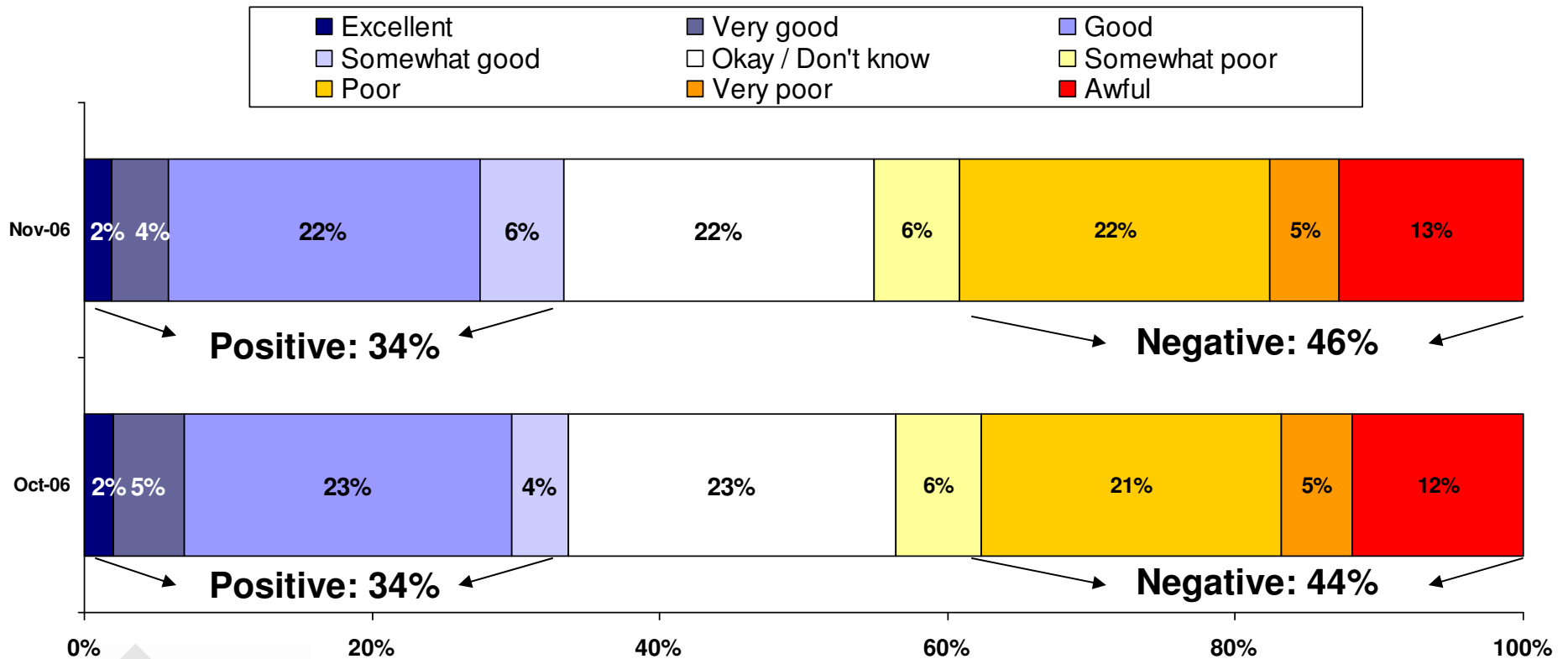

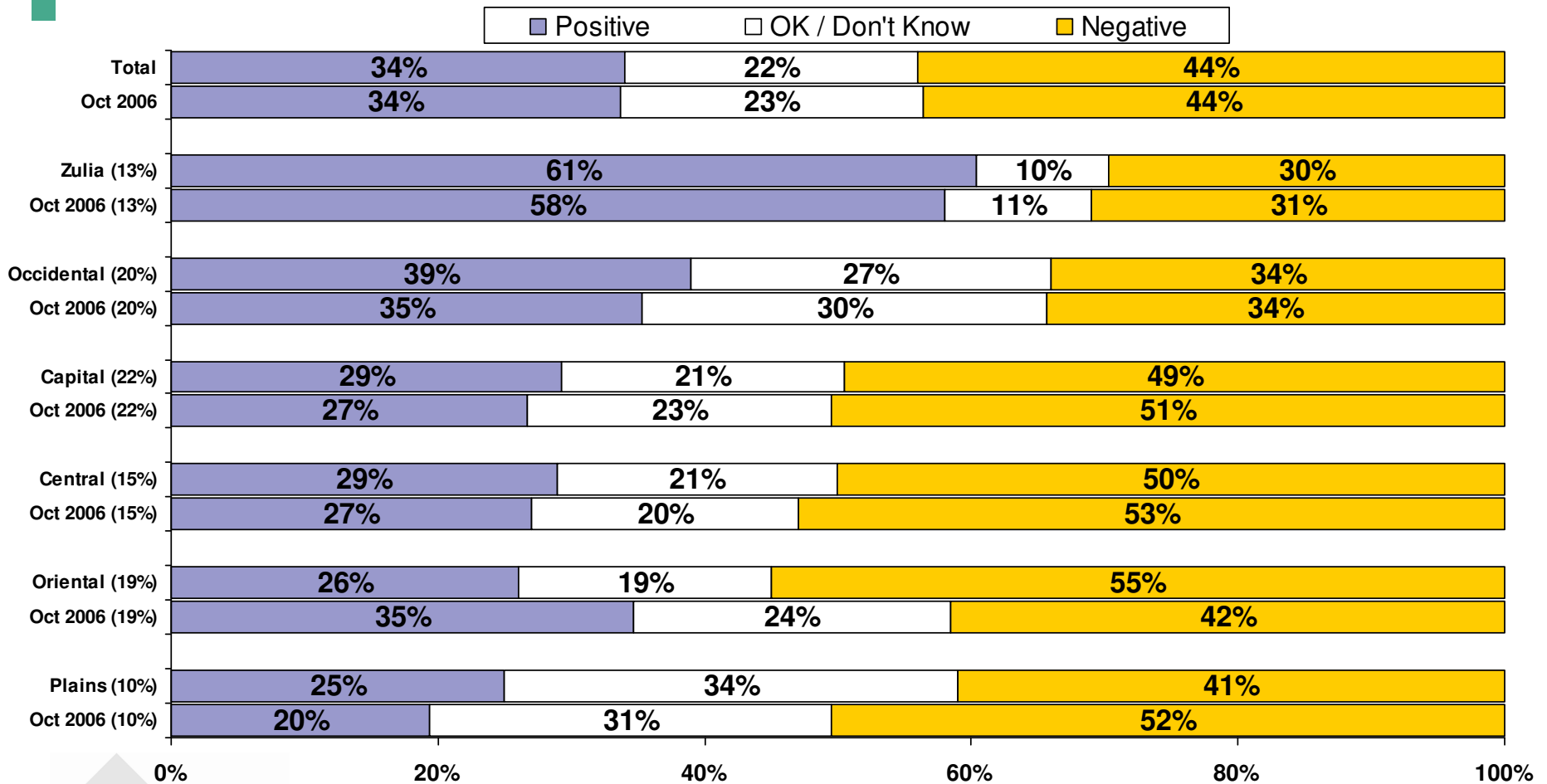
Job Rating

Evaluating the job of the governor of this state up until this point, has it been excellent, very good, good, somewhat good, somewhat poor, poor, very poor or awful?

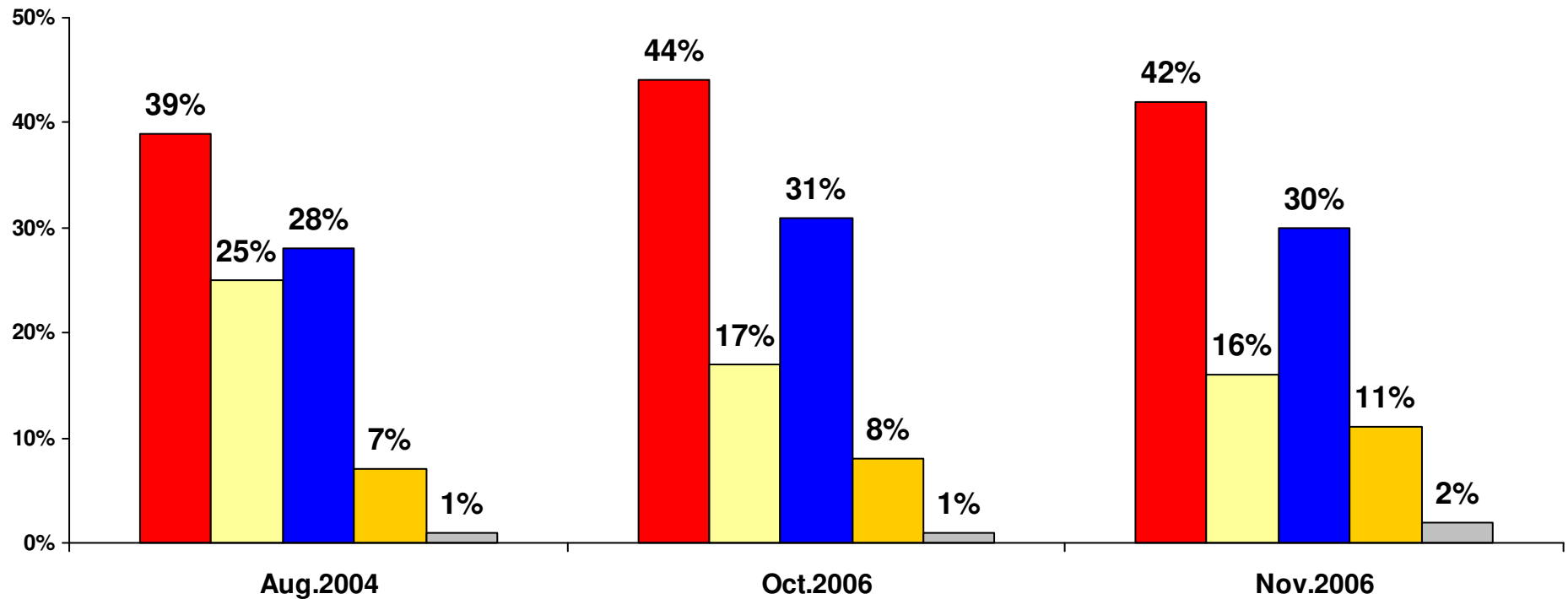


Governor Job Rating (By Region)

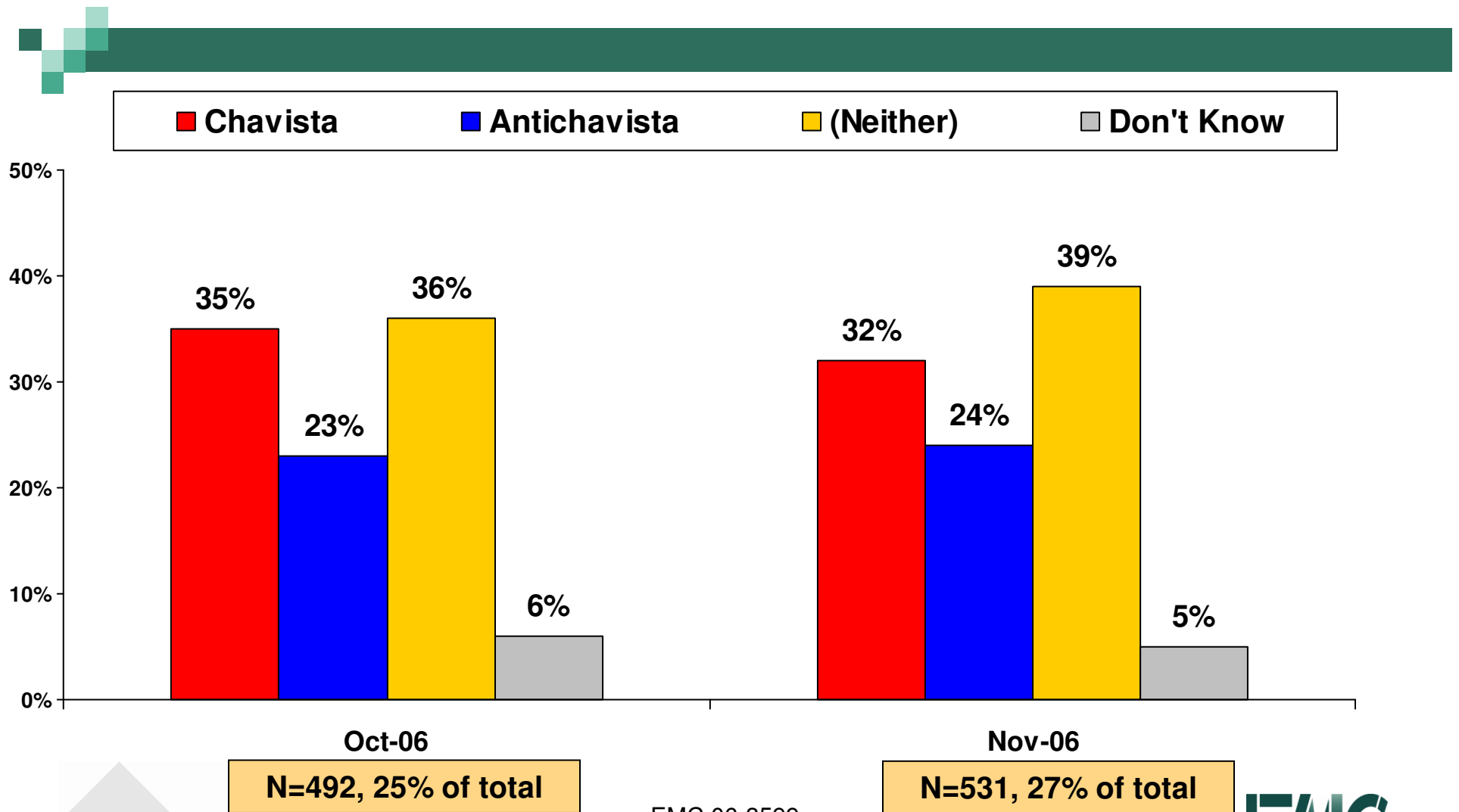


Chavista / Antichavista

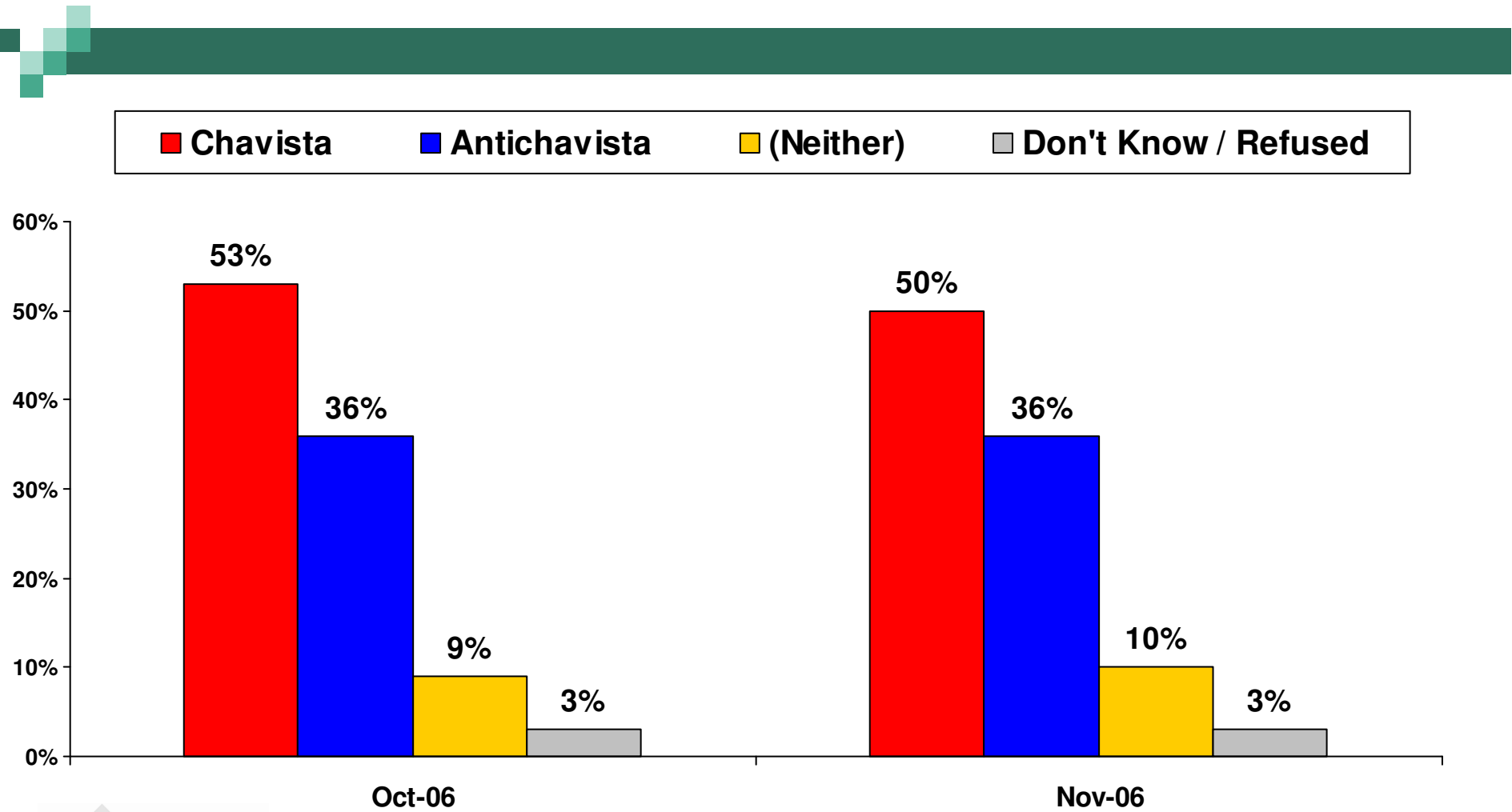

Chavista / Antichavista among moderate respondents

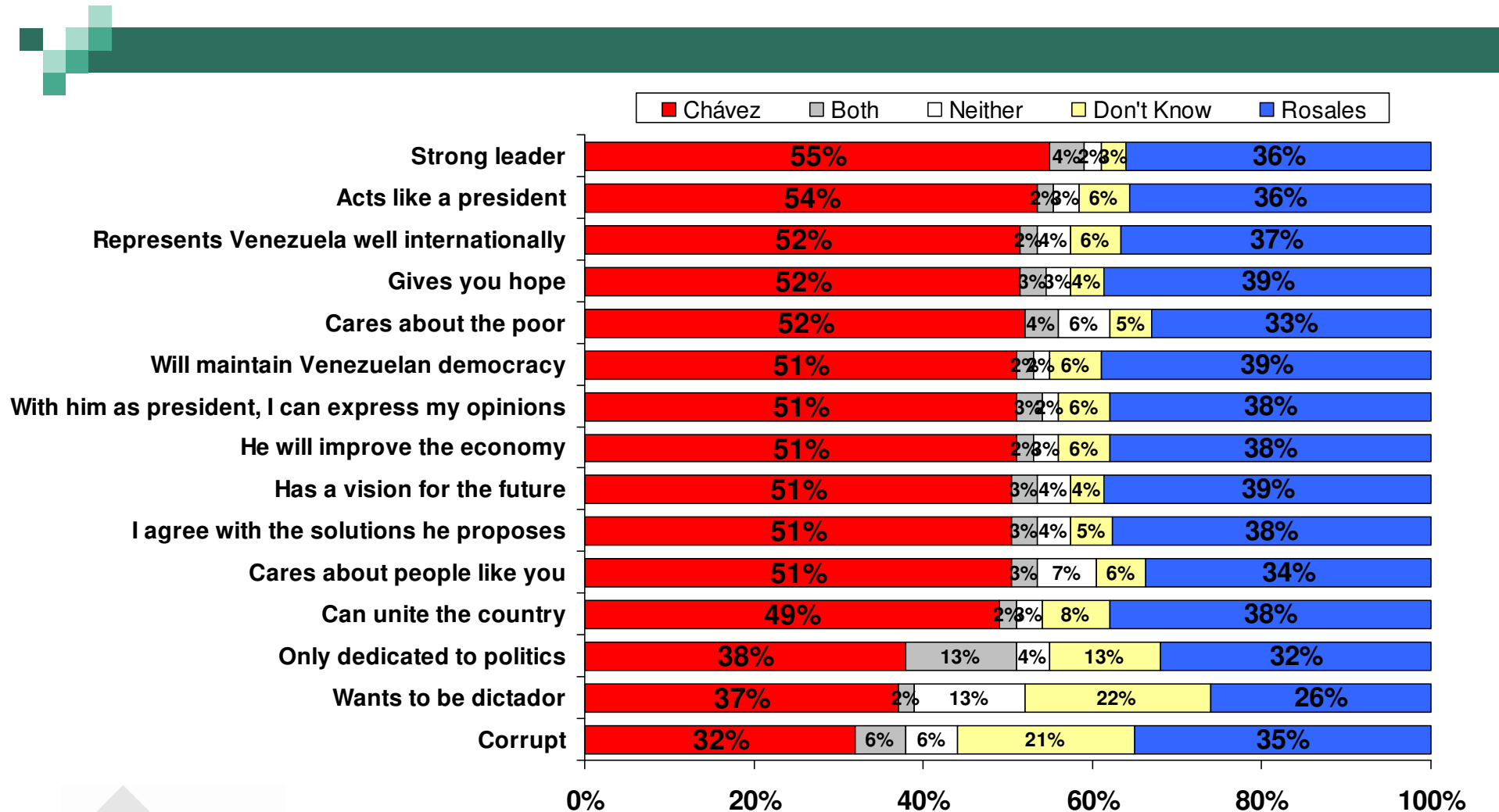


Chavista / Antichavista (Combined)

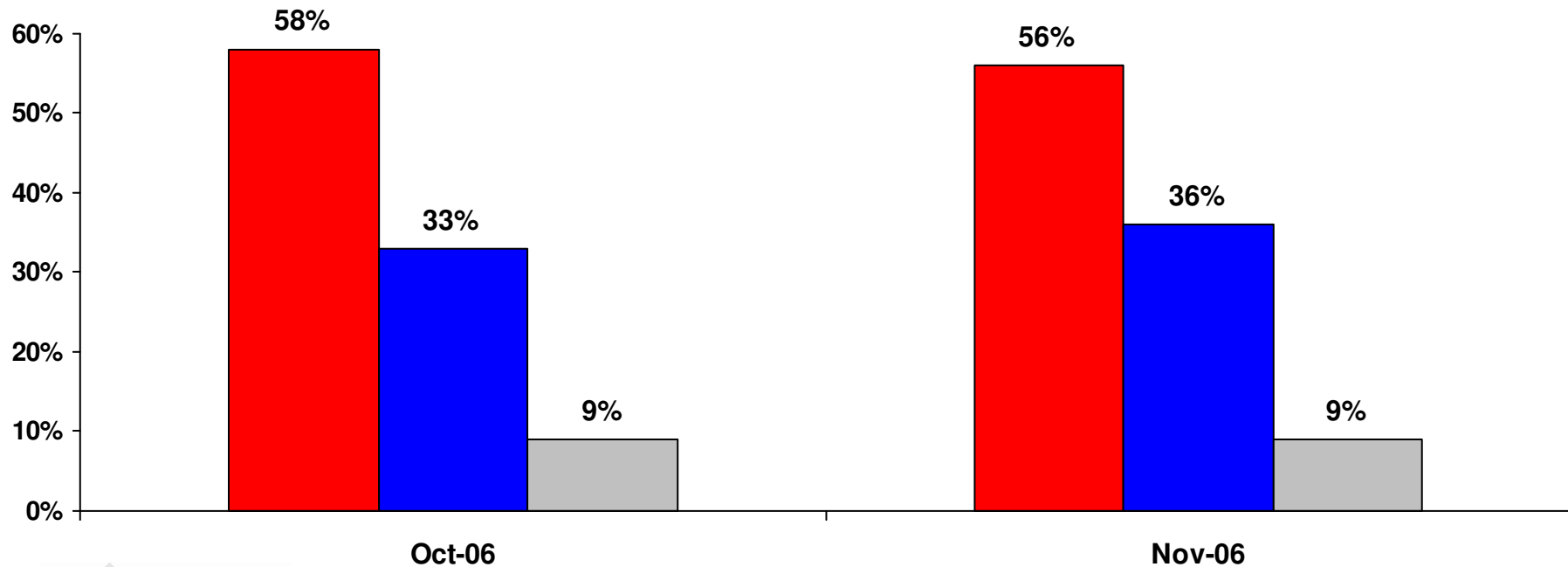

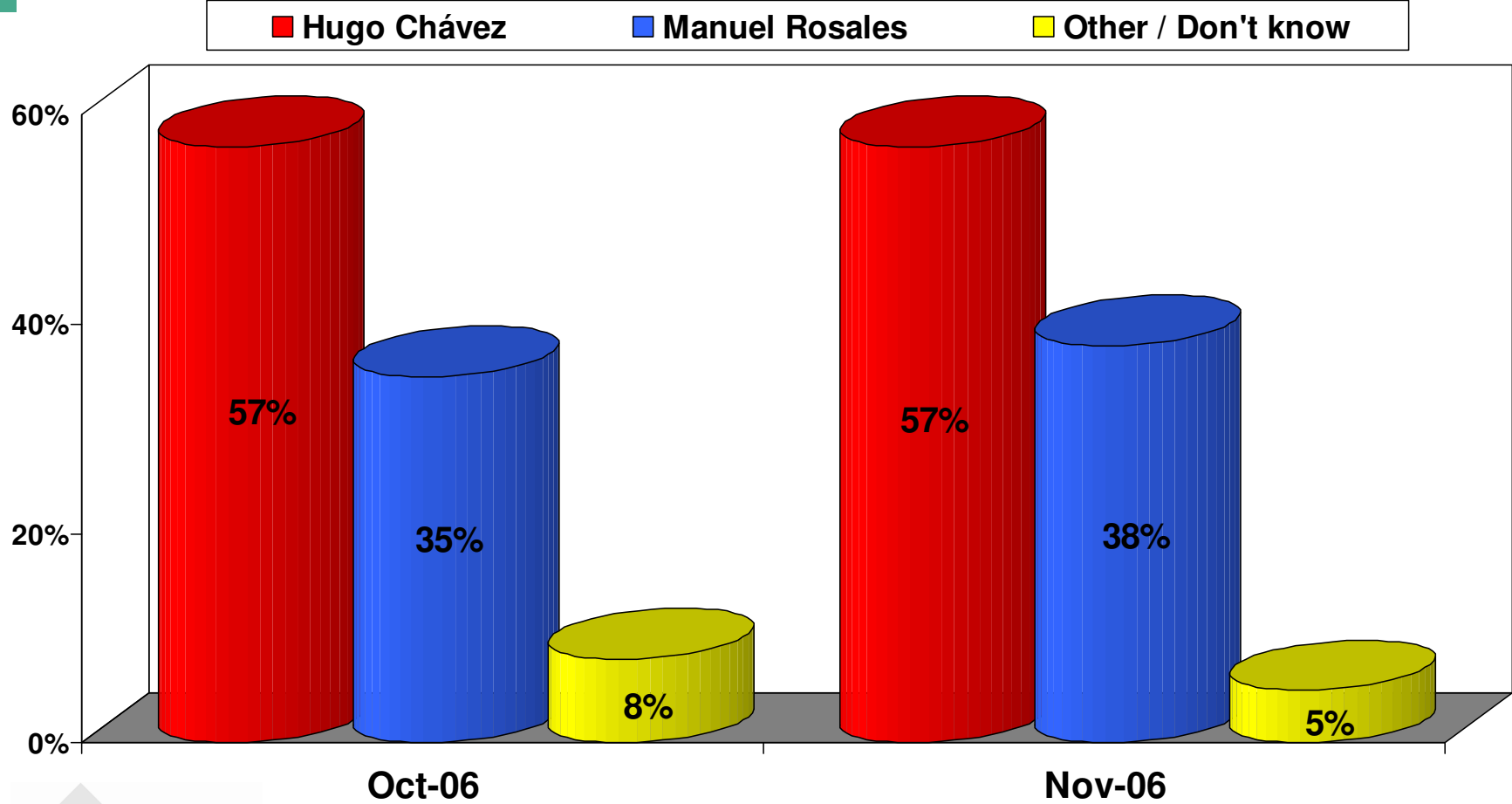
Prediction for the Election

Independent of your intended vote, who do you think will win the December 3rd presidential election: Hugo Chávez or Manuel Rosales?

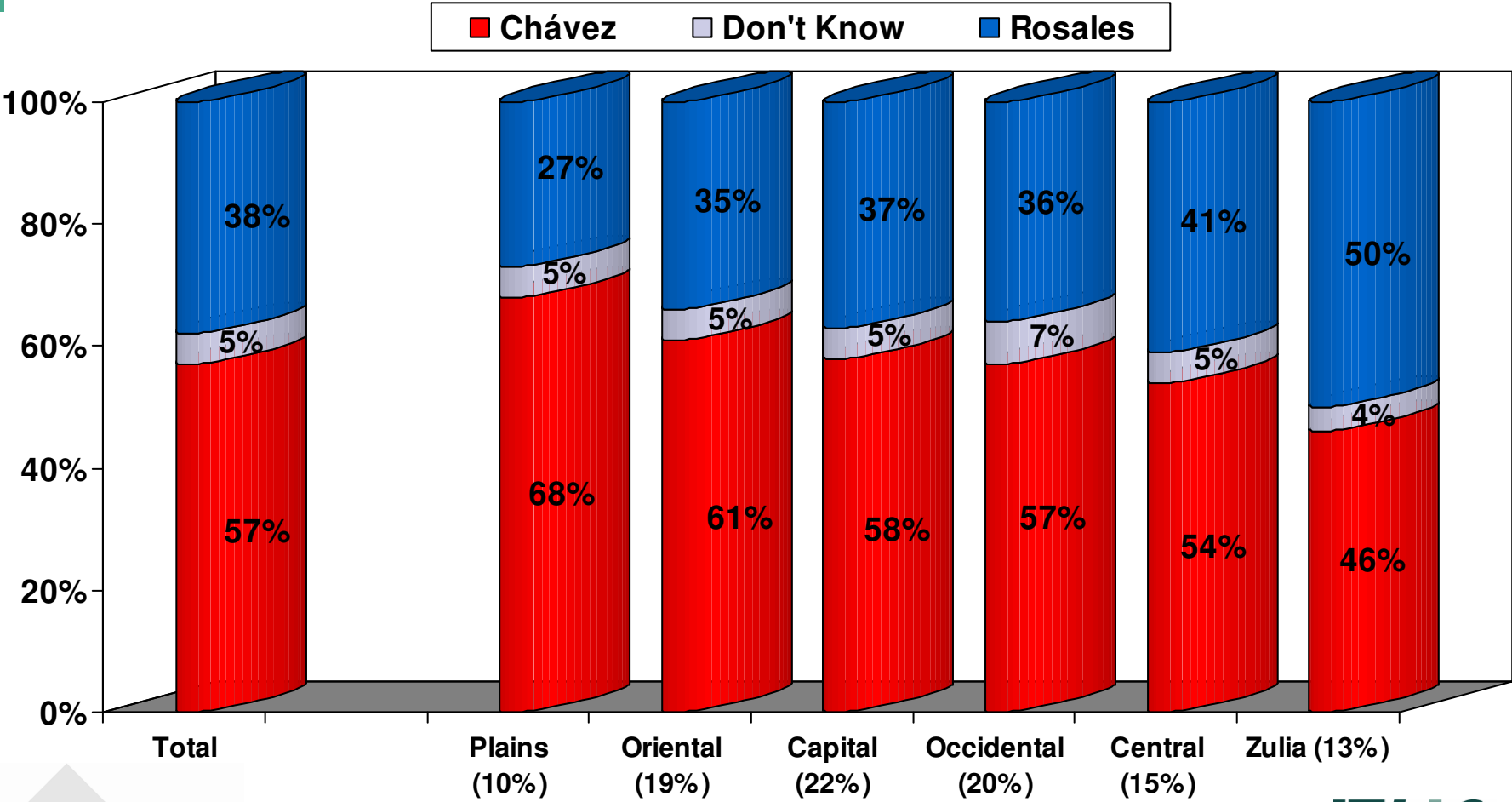

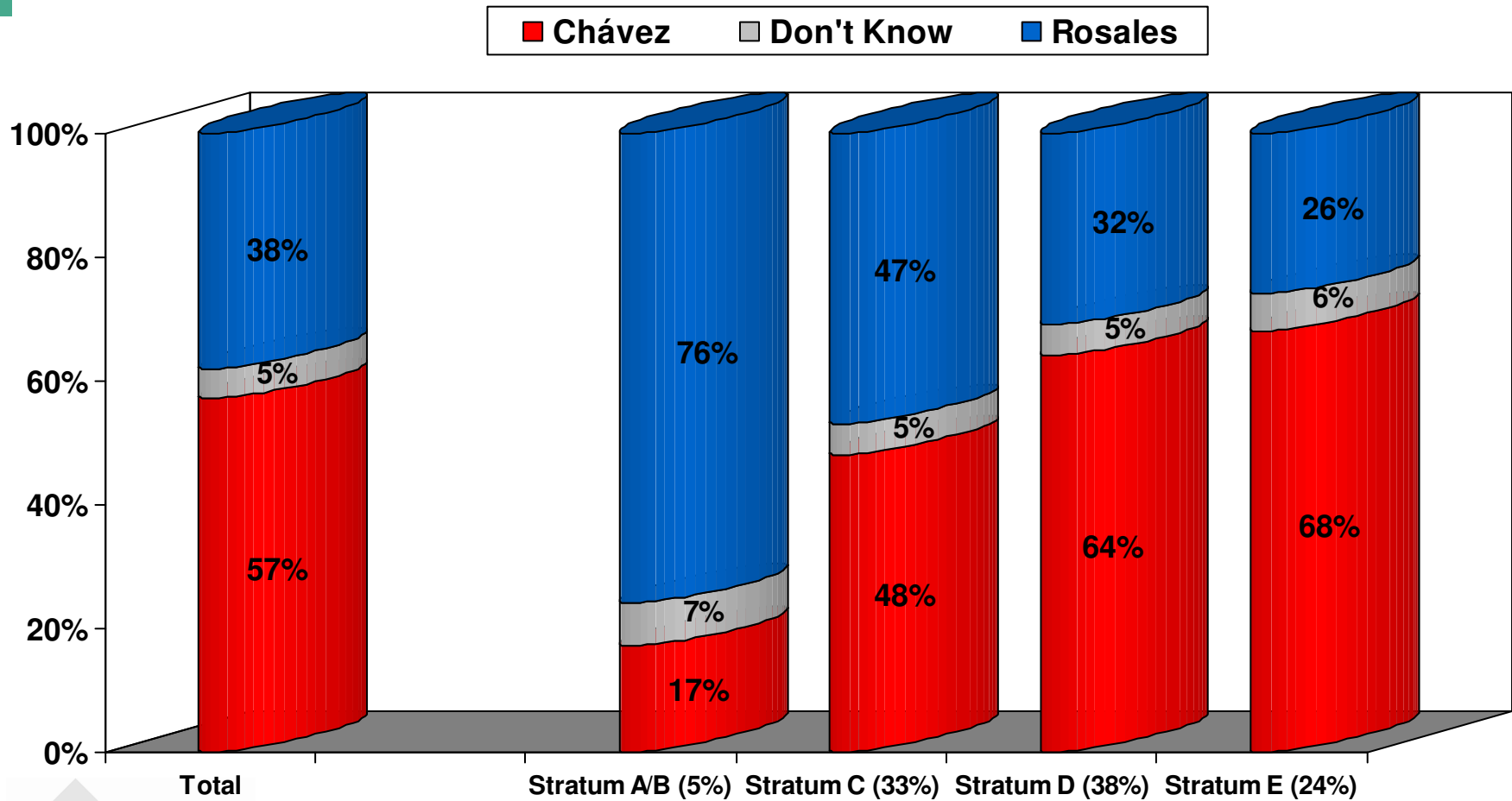

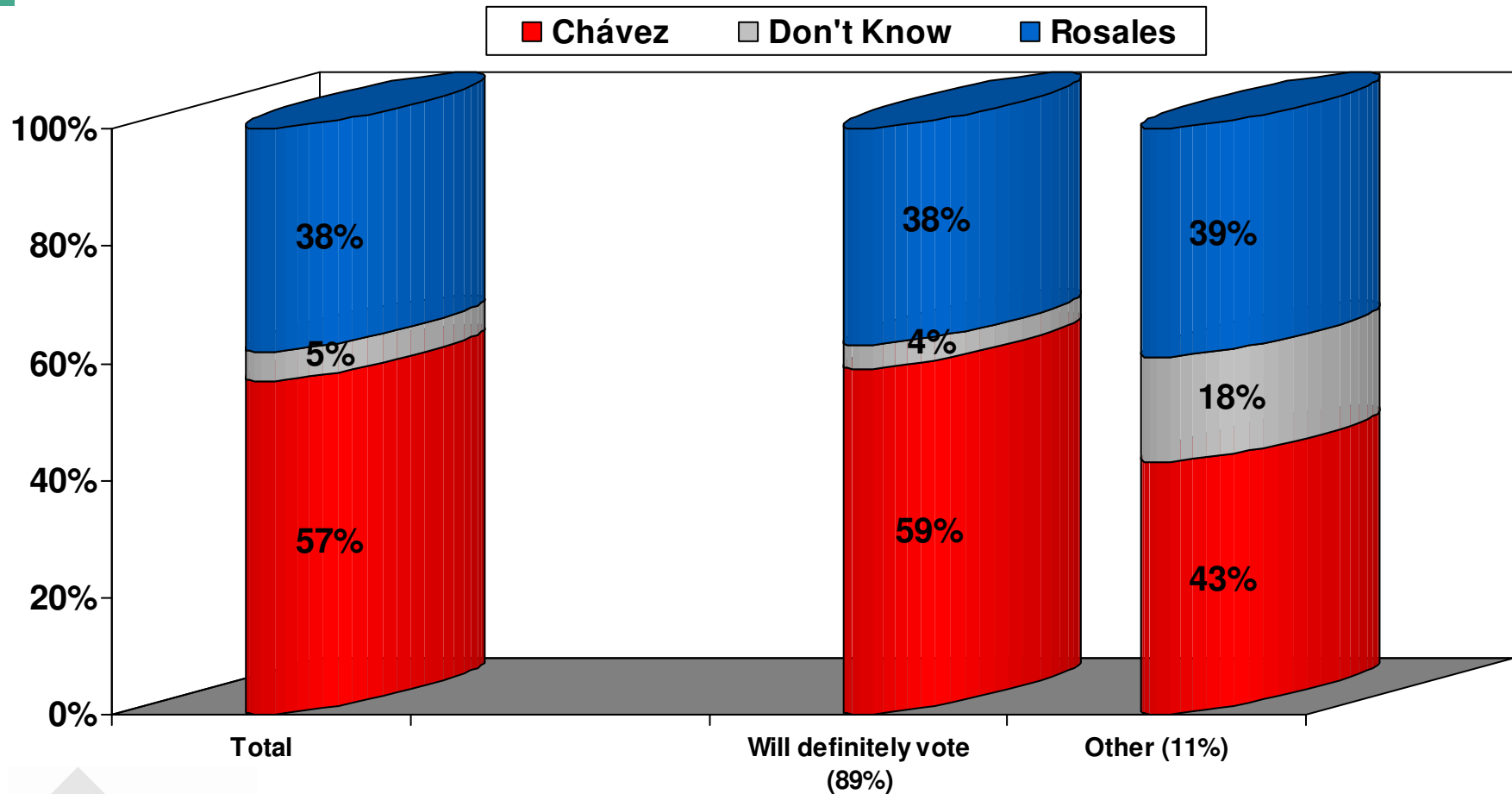

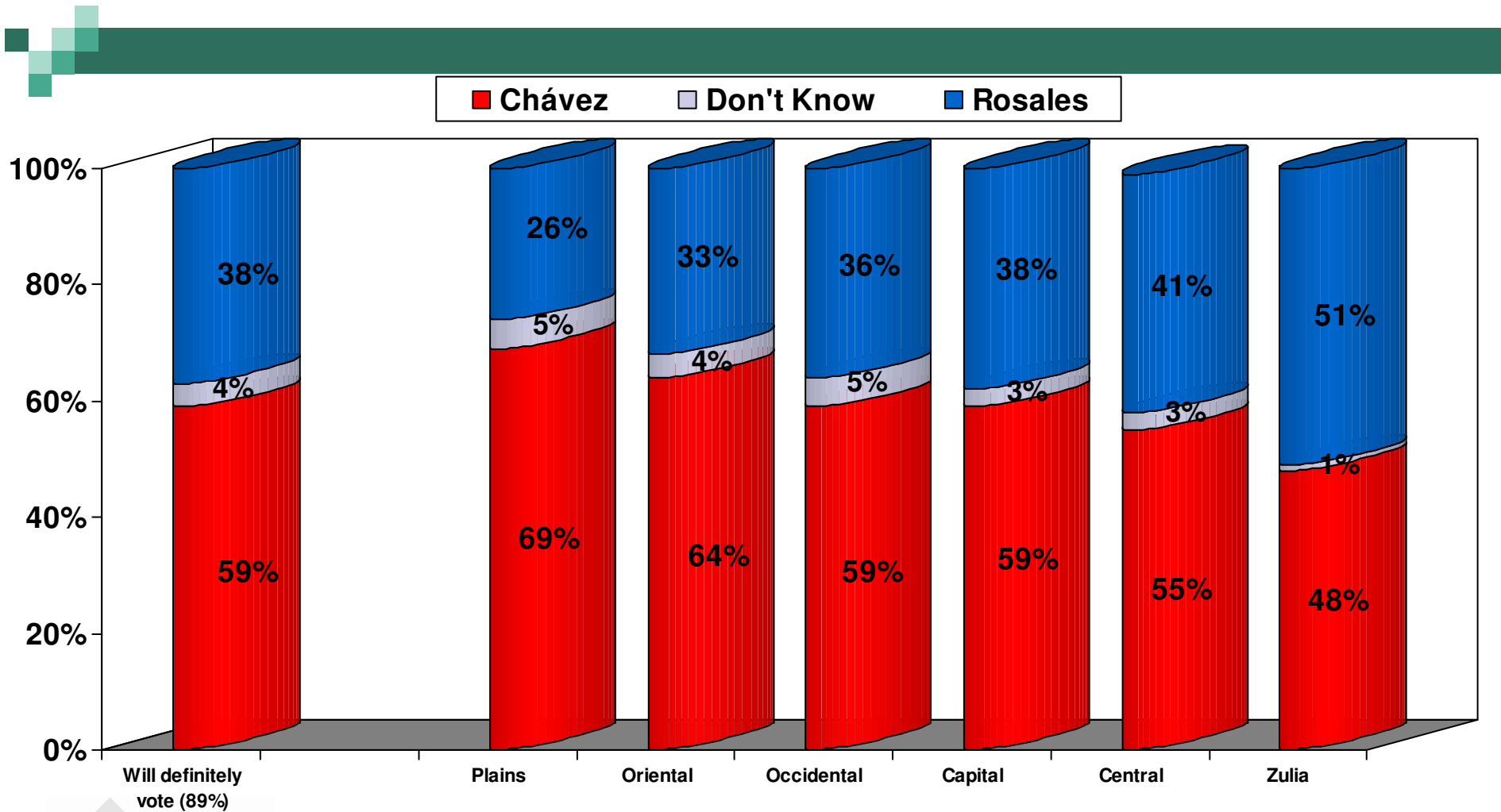

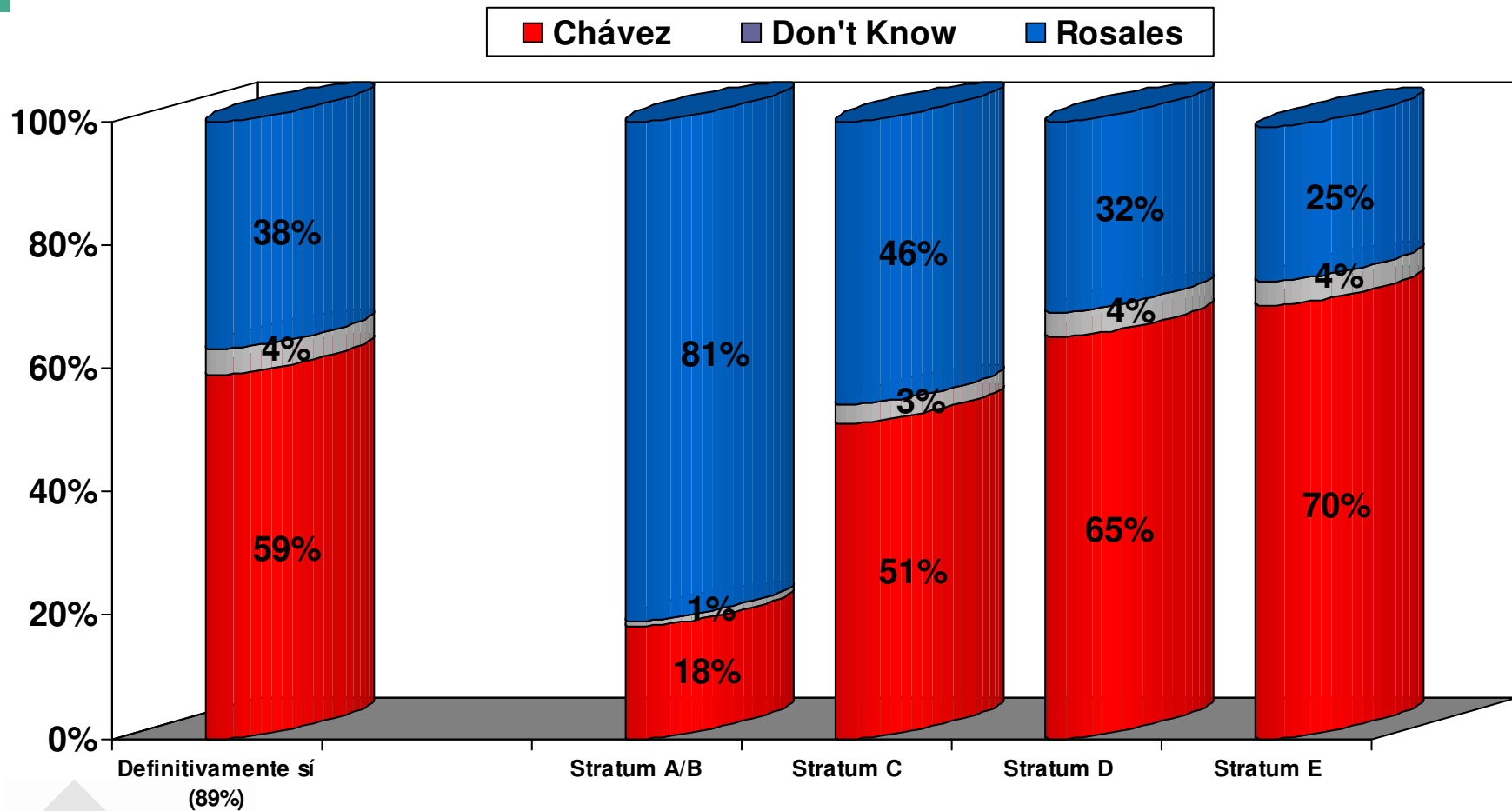
Presidential Vote (By Certainty of Vote)



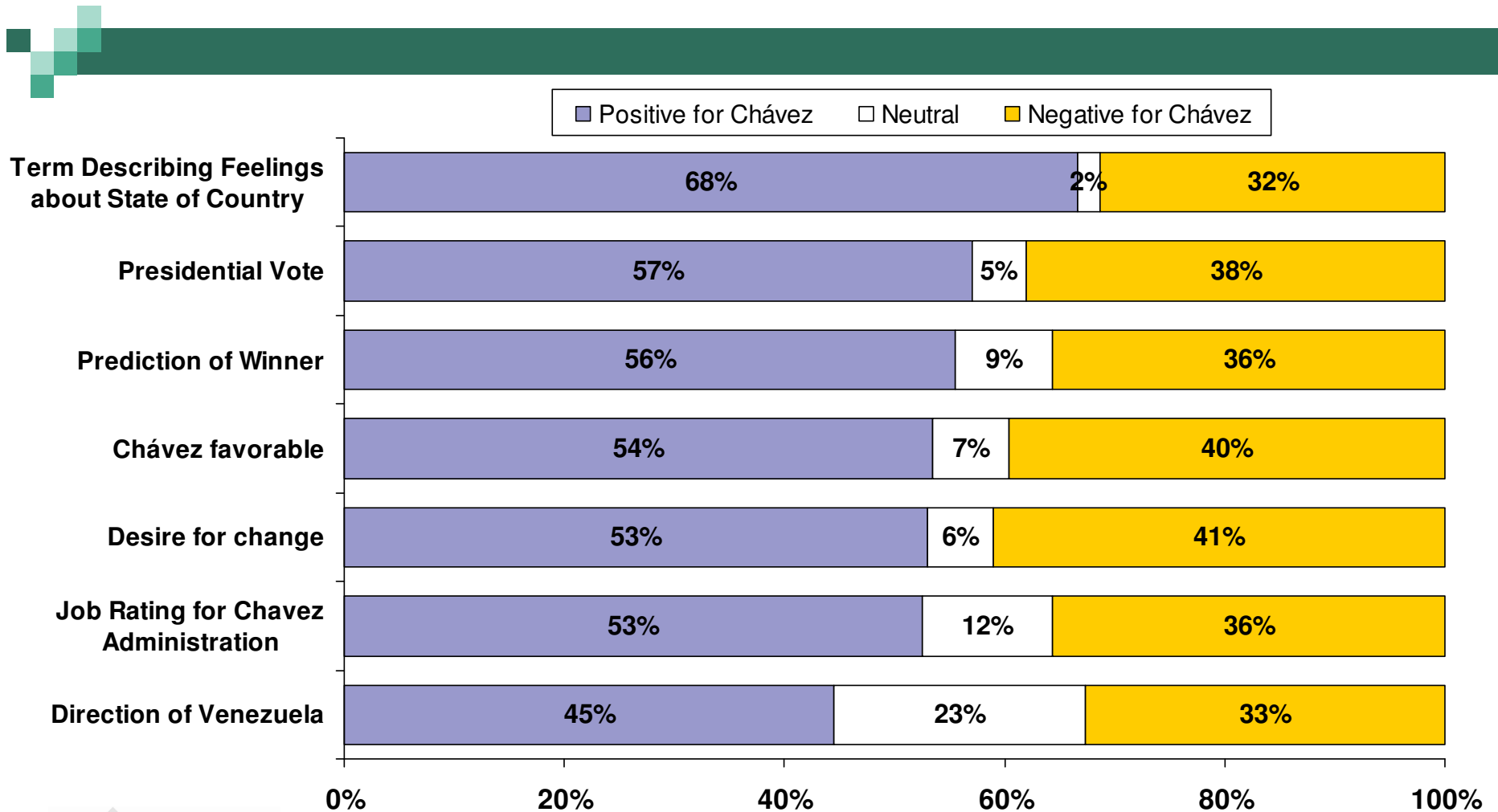
Presidential Vote by Region (Among those who say they will definitely vote)
